

Workshop on the History & Development of Psychoanalytic Theory & Technique

This is the second in a series of one-day workshops tracing the development of psychoanalytic theory from the foundations laid by Sigmund Freud up to the present day. Developments in Ego Psychology, the British School of Object Relations Theory, Self Psychology and Interpersonal Psychoanalysis will all be covered over the course of 3 (three) workshops. In addition, there will be presentations on the important contributions of Melanie Klein, Eric Erikson, Jacques Lacan and the Modern Freudians. Students completing the course of workshops will have been exposed to a comprehensive overview of the field of psychoanalysis as it exists today.

Participants in this second workshop will learn about the departures of the British School of Object Relations Theory from the *drive model* theories of classical Freudian thought, leading to the development of a *relational model* theory similar to that of Interpersonal Psychoanalysis. The second session of the workshop will focus on the object relations theory of Melanie Klein and the relationship of her thought both to classical Freudian psychoanalysis and the British School of Object Relations Theory. Morning and afternoon sessions will both include time for questions and discussion.

Purpose

This is the third in a series of workshops addressing both the diagnosis and psychodynamic treatment of Personality Disorders and also other fundamental aspects of psychoanalytically oriented therapy.

On the first day, participants will learn about the departures of the British School of Object Relations Theory from the *drive model* theories of classical Freudian thought, leading to the development of a *relational model* theory similar to that of Interpersonal Psychoanalysis. The second session of the workshop will focus on the object relations theory of Melanie Klein and the relationship of her thought both to classical Freudian psychoanalysis and the British School of Object Relations Theory.

On the second day of this workshop, Obsessive Compulsive Personality Disorder will be discussed in terms of its etiology, clinical diagnosis and treatment. The relationship of this personality disorder to the diagnosis Obsessive Compulsive Disorder will also be discussed.

The third day will focus on the topic of using patient's dreams in therapy. Different approaches to dream interpretation in psychoanalysis will be reviewed and an integrated technique for using dream material will be suggested.
